



Andrew graduated from Bowling Green State University with a Bachelor's degree in Science in Criminal Justice in 2009. In April of 2009, he started working for Lucas County Court of Common Pleas Work Release Division as a Corrections Officer. As a Corrections Officer, he was responsible for supervising felony offenders, enforcing departmental rules and regulations, transporting inmates, conducting searches, urine screens, and monitoring inmates, etc. Andrew worked as a Probation Officer for the City of Ashtabula Municipal Court from December of 2009 until February of 2015. As a Probation Officer, he was responsible for managing a caseload of 300 probationers, enforcing court-ordered supervision components and implementing supervision strategies, conducting presentence investigations and preparing presentence reports, preparing and serving probation violations, citations, and warrants, etc. In February of 2015, Andrew took the position of Court Administrator for the Ashtabula County Court of Common Pleas Probate/Juvenile Division, where he is still currently working. In this position, he is responsible for supervising and managing sixty plus employees in the Ashtabula County Court of Common Pleas Probate/Juvenile Division, overseeing all monthly, quarterly, and annual reporting as necessary for the Ohio Supreme Court, reviewing/amending/editing/drafting personnel policies and procedures, supervising and directing all juvenile and probate business functions, etc. In his experience as a Court Administrator, he has found ways to develop and expand current Juvenile Court programming through innovative approaches such as working with Ohio DYS and the Annie E. Casey Foundation to become a JDAI county in 2017, applied for and obtained approval from the Ohio Supreme Court to be the 2nd certified specialized docket program in Ashtabula County for Family Drug Court, and as an alternative to detention, opened Juvenile Court Resource Center in November 2017 and as a result closed detention facility in April 2018. The Resource Center started to run 24/7 and is now the first point of contact for all juveniles in Ashtabula County. Andrew is a member of several professional affiliations such as the Ohio Association of Court Administration, the Ashtabula County Prevention Coalition, and the Young Professionals of Ashtabula County, Board member of Ashtabula LEADERSHIP, Ashtabula Family Children First Council-Chair, and President of the Ashtabula County Board of Developmental Disabilities. He has been involved with the Big Brothers/Big Sisters program since 2015 and has been the Assistant Men & Women's Tennis Coach for St. John High School since 2014. Andrew has been married to his wife, Vanessa for the past 3 years and is expecting his first child (a boy, Andrew) at the end of September. He is excited to become a father and continue his work in Ashtabula County.
